

# **Need**

The SoRock community needs assessment survey results identified mental health and substance use as the top community concerns in 2022-2023. <u>Take the 2023-2024 Survey Here</u>



Youth high school data is collected every other year nationally through the <u>Youth Risk Behavior Survey</u> at no cost. Sanborn Regional High School & Pinkerton Academy data is released by the school district. Timberlane Regional High School does not currently participate in the survey. See all <u>NH Data Here</u> (2023 results not yet posted). When possible SoRock has funded middle school data collection for select schools. Due to the lack of available data from 4 of our towns, we do not have true aggregate data for youth in our catchment.

The most recent state YRBS Data (2021) indicated that **44%** of NH Youth Felt Sad Or Hopeless almost every day for 2 or more weeks in a row so that they stopped doing some usual activities, and **25%** reported that they had seriously considered attempting suicide. SoRock puts a heavy emphasis on mental health support and programming. Mental wellness is a protective factor against substance misuse.

The New Hampshire Office of Chief Medical Examiner reports that there have been 361 Overdose Deaths in NH as of 12-12-23

<u>Investing in Prevention Makes Good Financial Sense</u>. The <u>economic impact of substance misuse in NH</u> as of 2017, was \$2.36 billion a year in health and criminal justice costs, lost labor force participation and lost worker productivity.

# **SoRock in Washington DC**

# Governor's Youth Advisory Council

The Governor's Youth Advisory Council on Substance Misuse and Prevention (GYAC) was established to gain the youth perspective on issues amidst the opioid crisis. The purpose of the Council is to advise the Governor, from a youth perspective, on legislation, events, and media pertaining to substance misuse for the people of New Hampshire. They do this by finding creative ways to educate the youth of New Hampshire on concerning issues related to substance misuse and prevention. Providing review and comment to the Governor regarding public issues, projects, and proposals that have an impact on youth in regards to substance misuse and prevention and developing, organizing, and participating in school projects and positive activities involving youth and substance misuse and prevention.

SoRock supports GYAC by providing a program advisor, leveraging funds for GYAC apparel, providing resources and sponsoring youth representatives from Pinkerton, Sanborn and Timberlane high schools.





GYAC participated in a narcan training and were provided with SoRock Overdose Prevention Power packs including Narcan to take home.

# **Tobacco / Vaping Business Compliance Awards (SYNAR NH)**

In March SoRock went out with the South Central Public Health Network and some of our Timberlane youth to reward local businesses for doing their part to keep youth safe from nicotine products! These businesses passed state 21+ compliance checks with underage buyers in 2022!

We were able to thank Plaistow Walmart, Plaistow Market Basket, Plaistow Rite Aid, Smoker Choice in Plaistow, Atkinson Village Store, A&M Variety Sandown and the 1820 Market in Fremont with a certificate and window cling to share the success of their 2022 efforts. 2023 compliance checks are complete and we are looking forward to going out to reward new locations with youth in 2024!









## **NaloxBox Overdose Prevention Stations**

In early April we worked with Sandown Police Department and South Central NH Public Health Network to install a Naloxbox next to the AED machine within Sandown Town Hall. We would like to thank the town of Sandown for their proactive approach to these potentially lifesaving measures. The NaloxBox mission is to improve the capacity of bystander rescuers to save the lives of victims of opioid overdose with overdose response tools, including naloxone.

SoRock has Naloxbox's available for all of our towns (through a partnership with our public health networks). We have worked with each town to identify the most practical locations for interior mounting. We are now working on getting approval from the identified locations. A box has also been delivered to Kingston Community Library for installation early 2024. Please send questions about this initiative to sorocknhcc@gmail.com









# **Career Pathways to Prevention Trade Expo**

SoRock and the Seacoast Public Health Network partnered with Sanborn Regional High School Career Pathways program for the second annual "Gearing up for Success" trade expo. The trade expo is part of our regional Young Adult Strategies initiative to expose and connect youth to future career options in addition to a traditional four year degree path.

A clear plan exiting high school can help to prevent an increase in mental health and substance misuse concerns during the transition to adulthood.

Approximately 700 students in grades 8-12 visited the expo with lots of incentives to stop and learn more from each of our 50+ vendors! Surrounding school districts were invited to attend in their own time slots and the event is open to the community at the end of the day. The third annual Expo will take place in April 2024. # **Project Sticker Shock!**

During Alcohol Awareness month we visited Market Basket in Plaistow with TRHS Peer Outreach and Life of an Owl Youth groups for Project Sticker Shock! Youth put "Buyer Beware" stickers on cases of alcohol to remind shoppers of the consequences of purchasing alcohol for minors. SoRock partners with NH State Liquor Enforcement, Timberlane School District and New Hampshire National Guard Counter-drug Program on this important project! We would like to thank Market Basket Plaistow for allowing us to do this important program at their store annually! There are more than just criminal consequences for purchasing/providing alcohol for minors and for hosting underage drinking in your home!





DEA Take Back Days & Crush the Crisis at the new Parkland ER!







DEA's National Prescription Drug Take Back Day happens every April and October to encourage the public to remove unneeded medications from their homes as a measure of preventing medication misuse and opioid addiction from ever starting. SoRock partners with the DEA and our local Police Departments (and now Parkland ER!) to promote and carry out Take Back Days in our communities. SoRock worked with many of our towns over the years to install permanent Rx Disposal boxes. Permanent Rx Disposal bins are available year round at the Atkinson, Hampstead, Kingston, Newton, Plaistow and Sandown police departments.



SoRock towns collected nearly 900lbs of unused and expired medications in 2023! Thank you for doing your part!

# Climb Above Stigma/Stress Virtual Hike!

SoRock partnered with Timberlane Health Educators and Connors Climb Foundation in 2023 to create the first annual Climb Above Stigma/Stress. This campaign included mental health assemblies for middle and high school grades, a virtual hike **open to all SoRock communities** with prizes and school day projects for our youth groups with their own school communities. \$2000 was raised for Connors Climb and SoRock through sponsorships and T-shirt registrations and thousands of youth and adults helped to spread awareness and were impacted through participation!




























# **Mental Health Literacy for ages 5-10**

SoRock again partnered with the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention in 2023 to facilitate "Gizmo's Pawesome Guide to Mental Health" in three more elementary schools! This read along/activity program guides children through the importance of mental health by offering guidance on how to recognize and cope with sad, mad and worried feelings and related behaviors. The program makes managing their mental health – and knowing how and when to reach out to a trusted adult for further support – a simple, non-scary part of their everyday life. SoRock is excited to have **reached nearly 600 youth** from Danville, Hampstead and Sandown with Gizmo in 2023!

When possible we involved older youth to assist in reading and activities. These youth mentors received training in reading to and engaging younger students from their librarian! The involvement of youth mentors makes this program even more impactful to the younger kids!

# **Granite Youth Alliance - Ignite Change Youth Empowerment Summit**

We we excited to be bringing two of our high school youth groups to the Granite Youth Alliance "Ignite" Youth Empowerment Conference this year!

They had a packed schedule full of interactive workshops, skill building exercises, and time for producing a studio quality prevention video! # **Keeping Youth Safe Drug Education**

SoRock held forums to inform parents and educators of latest drug trends and dangers and what can be done to keep youth safe. We brought in presenters from DEA New England, Northern New England Poison Center and Seacoast Youth Services. Parent Power packs and Narcan kits were made available to parents and teachers at these presentations.

# **Parent Workshops**

SoRock offered two Staying Connected with your Teen Parent workshops in partnership with NH Teen Institute in 2023. Workshops were offered in the Spring and Fall and were located at the Plaistow YMCA.

Staying Connected with Your Teen® is a proven-effective, science-based, interactive workshop that gets parents and teens working together to enhance communication and family management practices and decrease conflict. Through a series of video- and workshop-based modules, parents improve their family management practices and strengthen the bonds between them and their children, resulting in substance misuse prevention, violence prevention, and positive character development.



# **Anxious Nation Documentary**

We partnered with our friends at CLM (Center for Life Management) and had a full house for our screening of the Anxious Nation documentary at the Plaistow Public Library.

Anxious Nation explores and captures the many faces and facets of anxiety. This feature-length documentary takes a deep look into the crisis of anxiety and mental health in America, especially its impact on kids (ages 10-26) and families.

We also had a panel of five amazing clinicians for a panel discussion and Q & A following the film.










# First Day Film

# SoRock partnered with the South Central Public Health Network to bring the two most recent Screenagers films in for two community showings.




# **Screenagers: Under The Influence**

# **Red Ribbon Week 2023!**

Red Ribbon Week is an annual event observed by the Drug Enforcement Administration and communities across the country. Inspired by a tragedy, this week of remembrance has helped spread awareness of drug misuse prevention. Communities collaborate with local DEA offices to organize events that bring people together in a united mission to end drug misuse.

During RRW SoRock offers assistance with materials and programming for all of our schools. This year we were able to provide materials to all of our schools through our partnerships with our public health networks, Drugs are Dangerous, Inc. and DEA New England. We also partnered with Northern New England Poison to bring assemblies to Hampstead Middle School, Ellis Middle School and Sanborn Middle and High Schools (offered to all schools).






























# Drunk, Drugged and Distracted Driving (3D) Awareness


# **LOA Presentation to NH Principals Association**

The Leadership Team of our Timberlane Life of an Owl program presented to roughly 15 principals from throughout New Hampshire about the program, which focuses on making wise choices and supporting our fellow students through quality peer to peer interaction. This team has also presented this program to other schools and have offered to be a resources for other programs throughout the state. Many student leadership programs across the State were hit hard by the pandemic, and we are partnering with our Timberlane group hoping to lead a movement to bring them back.

# Getting to "Y"

Pinkerton Academy and Sanborn Middle and High School participated in "Getting to Y" training this fall. This program teaches students how to understand, unpack and bring meaning and action to their own Youth Risk Behavior (YRBS) survey data in order to affect sustainable change in youth behavior, community, and school culture. # **FAQ:**

# Is SoRock a religious organization?

**No.** SoRock has no religious or political affiliation. SoRock is short for "Southern Rockingham" Coalition for Healthy Youth.

# SoRock has an office in Sanborn Regional High School, does that make you a Sanborn program?

**No.** SoRock currently has donated office space within Sanborn Regional High School, but our coalition steering committee members hold positions in community agencies and schools in/serving each of our towns. SoRock has previously held office space in the Sad Café in Plaistow and the Sandown Police Department.

SoRock is not employed by, or a program of any School District.

# How has SoRock historically been funded?

SoRock received a federal <u>"Drug Free Communities" grant</u> for 10 years. The purpose of this grant is to get the great work started and then turn it over to the communities. We are considered a "graduated program" along with several others in the state. We all work together to advocate for additional funding and have recently been included in the NH state budget for 50K for 2024. SoRock has been partially funded by our communities in varying degrees since aging out of the DFC program in late 2019.

# What is the tax impact of supporting SoRock?

The average tax impact of a SoRock warrant article or budget line item is around \$.01 per thousand or approximately \$5.00 per year for a \$500,000 property.

# What do our tax dollars pay for?

The funds we receive from our towns helps support our mission. Your investment yields a return of at least double or triple its value through leveraged resources and funding. We appreciate your support and would also love to have your voice at or table!

# Is SoRock a 501c3?

SoRock contracts with the <u>Southeastern Regional Education Service Center (SERESC)</u> for fiscal agency and our 501c3 status. This is a common practice also used by our state public health networks. This allows us to save money on additional staffing and indirect costs.
